Another priceless item from the Club Archive. To celebrate Sydney Wooderson breaking the World Record for the mile, a Dinner at the Waldorf. Above, the menu signed by three titans of British middle distance running. Firstly, Sydney himself, secondly his coach Albert Hill who won the 800 and 1500 at the 1920 Olympics. It would be over a Century before this feat was equalled by a British athlete, Kelly Holmes in 2004. Thirdly Walter George, a Club member until he turned professional, and World Record holder in 1886. He had also coached Hill. Initially Hill, a member of Polytechnic, was only selected for the 800 at the 1920 Olympics but he made a strong appeal to the Secretary of the AAA, Harry Barclay (later Sir), a Blackheath Harrier, and was eventually allowed to double up.

BEEF & TOMATOES A dish from the TOMATOES
1 ^{1/2} lb. shin of beef - roughly cut up 3 rashers of bacon - cut in squares 2 onions - peeled and sliced 4 tomatoes - peeled 2 cloves of garlic - sliced 1 glass of white or red wine 1 dsp. chopped, fresh rosemary, or a good pinch of dried 1 bay leaf salt & pepper to taste
Put beef into a casserole and cover it with the squares of bacon, then add the remaining ingredients. Bake with the lid on in a slow oven gas mark $\frac{1}{2} - 1$, electric 250-275 F for 3 -4 hours - delicious! I usually do creamed potatoes with this and almost any vegetable is good with it too.

150 years ago in October 1873

Peckham Amateur Athletics Club host two handicap competitions at Kennington Oval, within their annual sports meeting. The events are the 100 yards for which there are 39 entries and the mile which has 47. Admission to the ground is by ticket, at a cost of a shilling each. Winner of the Club's Quarter Mile Challenge Cup is T Dunning.

Two weeks later it's cross country as the Club commences its fifth Winter hare and hounds season from its headquarters at the Rye House Inn, Peckham Rye. "The runs will be held on alternate Saturdays, the hares starting at four o clock precisely and the committee will be pleased to see members of recognised clubs and bona fide gentlemen amateurs, introduced by members, the runs being strictly limited to the above. The runs take place regardless of weather"

125 years ago in October 1898.

The second edition of the Gazette appears and it's first marriage is recorded, that of J F Ponsford "May his career under the sign of the Entwined Hearts be as successful as under the Entwined Squares" Ponsford joined in 1884 and was first home for the Club at the Southern Cross Country Championships in 1887 (12th) and 1888 (11th) and finished in the top twenty on four occasions. He was also Hon Secretary for five years in the 1890s.

Vice President H J Barclay, President of the Southern Counties, takes the Chair for the first Smoking Concert of the Winter. The Club walking handicap takes place from Chislehurst to Blackheath Hill. There were forty eight entries with twenty five actually starting. Fastest times come from J Baker, E C Good, C J Lee Warner, T C Davis, H J Allanson and W G Suffield. "High tea having been discussed, a few rallies on the tournaments which have been so ably arranged took place, and a capital concert followed"

100 years ago in October 1923.

It's AGM time and outgoing President T C Davis nominates his successor. "There was no need to recommend one of his oldest pals, J F Ponsford, known to us all as a sterling sportsman, social giant, and capable organiser... The unanimous popularity of this selection reached its climax in the deafening applause, musical honours, and the Club Cry, accorded to our new President at his immediate installation"

The Club Five takes place and results in a win for S H Claydon with W C Colgate second and E J Castello third. The 55th Annual Bohemian Concert takes place at The Stadium Club, Holborn on Tuesday 30th October. It "was a complete and brilliant success from start to finish, surpassing its predecessors both in the attendance of four hundred and twenty... and in the exceptionally fine variety programme which was obviously greatly appreciated throughout by the audience"

75 years ago in October 1948.

The Club holds a New Members Night, "those present were unanimous in their verdict that "New Members Night" had come to stay".

The Club 5 takes place and the winner is Alan Brent, with W F Spencer second and G Scotting third in a field of 80. Scratch runner in the handicap was Sydney Wooderson but he was just having an easy run.

In the evening it is the AGM and President G H Wilkinson introduces his successor. It is W R J "Nobbie" Clarke who has been Secretary OF The Wine Committee for the previous eighteen years. He "made a short speech, referring to the suddenness of his almost literal transition from head cook and bottle washer to a higher plane". The Club History reflecting on his tenure on the Wine Committee comments "he waged his private war of food rationing in which he did more than win on points" "There was keen competition for election to the General Committee, no less than 15 nominations being put forward".

50 years ago in October 1973

It is Club AGM time and outgoing President Roy Morley introduces his successor. It is Tony Oldfield who suggests a useful slogan for the year, "Recruitment and Retention".

In the afternoon Bob Richardson wins the Club 5 with Peter Hamilton second and Mick Hamlin third.

It is a busy month for Bob. He wins the Wimbledon 10 in 49.00 and then leads a Blackheath team to victory in the Walton 10. He wins in 48.54 with Peter Hamilton 7th in 50.41, Chris Haines 16th (52.23) and Chris Woodcock 20th (53.11). Finally it is the Harlow Marathon where Bob is 13th in 2.20.43, Peter 31st (2.25.13), Barry O'Gorman 86th (2.40.11) and Peter Shepheard 125th (2.51.27). Blackheath are fourth in the team race.

25 years ago in October 1998

Mark Steinle finishes in sixth place at the Great North Run from Newcastle to South Shields. His time of 64.13 was on the slow side by his standards as it was run into the wind.

Mark is also a member of the Blackheath team who finish 15th in the National 6 Stage Road Relay along with Darrell Smith, Dave Heath, Joe Mills, Roy Smith and Dave Lee.

Mark also wins the Club 5 Cross Country title with Roy Smith second and Richard Daniels third. Lee Cooper is the first junior with Chris Gay second. First veteran is Cliff Keene.

Mark is selected to represent Great Britain in the Chiba Ekiden Relay in Japan.

Gemma Viney runs the second fastest time of the day in the Under 17 womens race at the Southern Womens Road Relay Championships at Aldershot.

At the Kent Young Athletes Road Relays, Blackheath win the under 13 boys (Tom Beech, Michael Shirley, Colin Norris); the under 13 girls (Eve Bugler, Vicky Ashley, Claire Berry); and the Under 17 Men (Imran Hamblin, Matt Hill, Will Bolton).
